Summary: Made up a bed for *Hunt* at *Moorhouse's*. Went to the meeting on 16th August 1819. "*Moorhouse* took his wife there. She was then in the family way.'

Mary Cadman examined by *Mr. Litledale*—I was a servant with *Mr. Moorhouse* last August. On the 8th of August, there was a bed made up for him there.

Here *Mr. Hunt* rose, and admitted that he slept there; it was not therefore necessary to examine her further on that point.

Cross-examined by *Mr. Barrow*—She had been a servant at *Moorhouse's*. He was a good religious man, and used to read the Bible very often for his family. Witness went to the meeting on the 16th of August. There were a number of women and children there. She was not a servant to *Mr. Moorhouse* then. *Moorhouse* took his wife there. She was then in the family way. She saw no children there belonging to *Moorhouse*. He has eleven children; six by his present wife.
