CHRONOLOGICAL ACTIVITY WORKSHEET

Put these events in chronological order:

- 200-300 special constables arrive and form a double line between hustings and magistrates' house.
- Manchester and Salford Yeomanry advance on hustings. Deputy Constable Nadin & other officers follow and arrest Hunt.
- Captured flag displayed in window of Tate's grocer's shop, New Cross, provoking a riot that continues into the night.
- Protestors assemble in surrounding towns around Manchester.
- Hunt begins speech. The magistrates claim the Riot Act is read, but no independent witness saw or heard it.
- Magistrates issue warrant for the arrest of Hunt and other speakers.
- Manchester and Salford Yeomanry arrive on field, knocking down and killing William Fildes (age 2) on the way.
- First protestors start to arrive on St Peter's Field.
- Manchester and Salford Yeomanry attack hustings and surrounding crowd. Crowd panics and begins to flee.
- 15th Hussars arrive, followed by Cheshire Yeomanry. On request from Hulton, Hussars charge to disperse the crowd.
- Hunt and other arrested reformers taken to New Bailey courthouse to be charged.
